Tamara (Tami) Ann Bateman, 75, of Moses Lake, passed away on Sunday, January 31, 2021.

Tami was born to the late John B. Bateman and Wilma Yvonne (Rogers) Bateman in Rupert, Idaho in 1945. Shortly thereafter, the young Bateman family relocated to Payette, Idaho where her surviving siblings Tony and Diana were born. In the early 50's the Bateman family moved first to Othello, then Moses Lake.

In 2006 she was diagnosed having cancer (Multiple Myeloma). She was a strong fighter and kept living a productive life for many years, far exceeding all professional prognoses. In 2016, Tami moved back to Moses Lake to be near her sons. Even through her last years of setbacks and pain she always did her best to display strength with little complaint when others would have broken. Through her, we know what true resilience is.
