December 26, 1919 - May 15, 2008

Alfred A. Conner, a Moses Lake resident for 57 years, died Thursday, May 15, 2008, in the LakeRidge Special Care Center at Moses Lake. He was 88.

Alfred was born Dec. 26, 1919, at Iola, Kansas to Isaac and Effie (Vanderslice) Conner. On Jan. 12, 1941, he married Evelyn M. Funston in Iola.
