After retirement, she tended her flower garden, spent time camping with the family, made quilts, sang in the church choir and doted on her family. She had a knack in the kitchen, producing many tasty dishes – especially her pies.

Betty suffered from dementia and lived at Summer Wood for the past two years. A special thanks to the understanding staff who gently cared for her

needs. In her early years, she was very elegant and well dressed, and even through her illness, she enjoyed wearing beads and jewelry.
