



## Brian Allen Waters

December 4, 1970 - January 13, 2021

Brian Allen Waters, an aviation mechanic and long-time resident of Moses Lake, WA, died unexpectedly on January 13th 2021, at the age of 50 in his home.

Brian was born on December 4th 1970 to Allen and Joan Waters in Seattle, WA. After graduation from Kirkland High School in 1989, he went on to Wenatchee Valley Community College and Big Bend Community College to study aviation and obtain his A&P license and degree.
