Dorothy Brown, 79, Moses Lake resident passed away Thursday, May 5, 2011 at Samaritan Hospital. Funeral services will be held at 2:00 p.m., Tuesday, May 10, 2011 at Kayser's Chapel of Memories. Private interment will be at Royal Memorial Gardens, Royal City.

Dorothy Elsie Brischle was born April 14, 1932 in Spokane, Washington, daughter of the late William and Elsie (Emtman) Brischle. She was the fifth of six children born, the late Evelyn and Ralph and survived by Helen, Margret and Mary.
