Emmett S. Mishler passed away in the early morning hours of February 4, 2013 with his daughter Cheryl Rondestvedt and son-in-law Odin by his side at Coventry House in Othello. Emmett was born on October 15, 1924 to Mack and Winnie Mishler in Winfield, Kansas. Emmett served proudly in the US Army in World War II as a platoon sergeant in Italy.

He was a 32nd degree Mason. The one thing he enjoyed was music and was a member of the Old Time Fiddlers where he played the mandolin.

Emmett retired after 38 years with Boeing in 1989 as a machinist in the wind tunnel in Seattle. Both loved to go RVing and that is what they did until 2004 when they built a home in Texas. They moved to Moses Lake in 2007 to be nearer to their daughter and grandchildren.
