Following high school he entered the military and served in Korea where he earned several awards including two Bronze Service Stars.

Blackie was preceded in death by his wife, Barbara of 29 years, son Michiel, and grand daughter Mariah but is survived by the second love of his life, Norma I. Burleson. He is also survived by his children Dennis Meyers (Karen), Timothy Meyers (Theresa), Misty Noel (Michael) and Deana Moser (Dale). He was blessed with eight grandchildren and seven great grandchildren.

Blackie spent his entire working life as a railroad engineer. He had colorful stories of his life on the rails and loved sharing the history he experienced with friends and relatives. Blackie retired from Burlington Northern in 1995. Following his retirement, he traveled extensively with Norma.
