Isabelle was born on December 7, 1915 in Russell, Iowa daughter of the late Lester and Junia (May) Van Nice. She was married to Raymond R. Winship, Sr. on November 19, 1941 in San Francisco, California. They lived in South California, first in Glendale then Van Nuys, and then Canoga Park. Their four children were born in California.

In 1955 they moved to a farm in the Columbia Basin Irrigation Project near Warden which they broke out of sagebrush. They retired from farming in 1990 but continued to live at the family farm house in Warden.

She loved spending time with family and friends.

Survivors include 2 daughters, Mary and Alice; son, Allen (Nunn) Winship; grandsons, Erik, Ryan, and Brent.

Besides her parents and husband, Isabelle was preceded in death by a son, Raymond Winship, Jr.

From Hwy 17, at Pheasant Run Gas Station, follow signs to Warden. Head East on SR170 two miles to Warden city limits. Go another mile past the airstrip, potato warehouses and two sets of train tracks. Go past South County Road (U), which leads to the cemetery. The road turns into W 1st St as you enter town. Arrive at Main Street a few blocks past S. Co Road U. The Euro Restaurant is on the right hand side as you are heading East. It is in the old Warden Tavern building. When heading East, if you pass the Post Office, you've gone a block too far.

We will probably arrive at the restaurant between noon and 12:30 pm, after a very brief service at the cemetery.

Warden Cemetery – Sunset Memorial Gardens

From Hwy 17, at Pheasant Run Gas Station, follow signs to Warden. Head East on SR170 two miles to Warden city limits. Go another mile past the airstrip, potato warehouses and two sets of train tracks. Turn South on South County Road. (Designated as U SE as you get out into the country.) Go about 1 ½ miles South to the cemetery.
