On November 28th, 2021 Lucinda Schaat West, 68, beloved wife, mother, and sister completed her journey here on earth. Lucinda was born on Dec. 11th, 1952 to Frank and Dorothy Schaat in St. Anthony Idaho. She was the 2nd born of 5 siblings.

She graduated from Moses Lake High School where she had met the love of her life, Bill West, in Drivers Ed. He asked to borrow a pencil and she was smitten from that moment on. They were married on December 28th, 1971, and later sealed for time and all Eternity in the Seattle Washington Temple.

After moving back to Washington, while living in Tacoma and after many difficult years of trying, Sarah Dorothy came into the world. 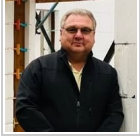
