Nancy was born on December 1, 1951, daughter of Emery and Barbara Carvo in Yakima, Washington. She was the fourth child of nine. In 1955 the family moved to Moses Lake, Washington. Nancy graduated from Moses Lake High School in 1970 and attended Washington State University. Nancy married in 1973 and she moved to Waipahu, Hawaii for three years, where she gave birth to her first son, Christopher Kanoff. In 1976, Nancy moved back to the continental U.S. where she lived in Okanogan, Washington and her second son, Matthew Kanoff, was born. Nancy moved back to Moses Lake, Washington where she resided for the remainder of her life. Nancy worked at REC in Quality Control until her retirement.

Nancy is preceded in death by her parents Barbara and Emery Carvo, her sister Janis Carvo, her brother-in-law Dwight Du Vall, and her nephew Justin Carvo.
