She graduated Moses Lake High School in 1967 and then from Big Bend Community College in 1969.

In 1971 she graduated with a degree in Office Administration and the following week they were married at the Moses Lake Presbyterian Church on June 12th.

Norma worked at J.C. Penny's in the accounting department for two years until the birth of her first daughter, Stefanie, and followed by Megan three and half years later. She could not have been happier to become a homemaker, where she was able to stay home to raise their daughters and do the accounting for the family farm. For being a city girl, Norma spent almost 40 years living on the family farm in Warden. She took immense pride in her family, home, and yard. In 2012 Lynn and Norma moved to Moses Lake into the home of her dreams that she helped design.
