



## Pauline Joan Duvall

January 27, 1931 - February 6, 2013

Pauline Joan Duvall was called home to her Savior February 6, 2013, her loving family at her side. Pauline was born January 27, 1931 in Rochester, Minnesota to Paul & Mildred Mattson. She was the youngest of three and the only daughter. Pauline was raised in Rochester, Minnesota and graduated from Rochester High School in 1949. She was an excellent ice skater and loved to perform with her ice skating team. She was also a great swimmer on the high school swim team. She worked for the Mayo Clinic for two years after high school and really enjoyed that.

Pauline met DeMar Duvall while he was serving his mission in Rochester, MN. After the completion of his mission, DeMar and Pauline fell in love and were sealed for all time and eternity on July 16, 1951 in the Logan, Utah Temple. They moved to Vernal, Utah to farm. After two months of marriage DeMar served in the Air Force during the Korean War and they lived in San Antonio, Cheyenne, and Riverside, California for the next two years before moving back to Vernal, Utah. In Utah DeMar farmed and they had two children. In 1955 Pauline & DeMar moved to Moses Lake where they would farm and make their happy home together raising 10 children.

Pauline loved watching sports. She loved watching her husband, children and grandchildren play sports and watching sports on TV. She and DeMar kept statistics for the MLHS girls varsity basketball team for many years in the

1980's. Pauline loved her many cats which she had throughout her life. She loved to sing and to bird watch. Pauline had a sweet tooth and loved candy especially black licorice, taffy, cinnamon bears, creamsicles and anything chocolate! Her kids and grandkids could always count on her candy drawer and being spoiled when they visited grandma!

Pauline loved her Savior Jesus Christ and her Heavenly Father dearly and belonged to the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints. Pauline had many callings in the church. She was a faithful visiting teacher to many friends, the Stake Young Women's President, served in the Stake Relief Society Presidency more than once, but her favorite calling was serving in the Primary for 33 years! Pauline loved children! She was the Primary President, counselor and taught every class in Primary and loved every minute of it. She received an LDS Primary medallion for her 33 years of loving service.

Pauline is survived by her husband of 61 years DeMar E. Duvall of Moses Lake, WA. She loved him dearly and looks forward to the day they will be reunited forever. 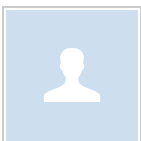
