Randy Layne Barkle passed away Dec 3, 2021 at Samaritan Hospital, from renal failure. He was born January 23, 1952, in Tremonton, Utah, to Lyndon F and Ruth (Sandall) Barkle. In 1953 the Barkle family moved to Moses Lake with U & I Sugar. Randy graduated in 1970 and married Susan Howe that same year. After graduation, Randy went to work for U & I.
