He was proud to be a Tejano, even after his family moved to Washington in the late 50's. Rolando spent a lot of time in Texas because of his very special relationship with his grandmother Maria Martinez.

Rolando graduated from Moses Lake High School in 1970. He went on to graduate from Big Bend Community College, Central Washington University and Gonzaga Law School. He was very inspiring to those within the Mexican/Latino community. He graduated high school at a 4th grade reading level and defied odds by becoming an attorney, having his own practice in Yakima, Washington. Before finishing his schooling he was a manager at Northwest Rural Opportunities (NRO) which helped promote prosperity with the Mexican community. He also worked as a probation officer mentoring all those around him. In addition to these feats, he also spent many years serving as a board member at El Centro De La Raza in Seattle.

He was amazing to watch in the courtroom, but as soon as he got home, he was outside doing yard work and tending to his roosters and pigeons. He was

always exaggerating stories from growing up in Westlake, illustrating his crazy adventures and how he raised his three children. He enjoyed moving back to Moses Lake to be near friends and family. He could be incredibly stubborn, but the people around him knew that he was one of a kind; very intelligent, honest, and down to earth.

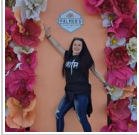
