It is with great sadness that our family announces the passing of Sharon Kay Davis. Sharon was born on July 7, 1940, and passed away peacefully on Saturday, April 5, 2025, surrounded by her family.

Sharon was the firstborn child of Howard G. Flanagan and Ruthe Irene Flanagan, and grew up in Sebeka, Minnesota, alongside her younger siblings, Dennis and Lois.

While in school Sharon played the trombone, sang in the girls' choir, and was a member of FHA. She graduated in the top 5% of her high school class and earned a scholarship to the Swedish Hospital School of Nursing in Minneapolis.
