Terry Wayne Hebdon was born July 16th, 1957 in Ephrata WA, to Keith Auger and Idris Egbert Hebdon. One of 7 children, he was taught the value of hard work, responsibility, honesty and integrity, a love for family, and a faith in and love for God.

He attended Ricks College and then served a mission in Spain for the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints and has continued serving faithfully in many positions through the years.

Terry enjoyed farming and followed his dream to live in Royal City and farm with his dad and family, eventually purchasing the business when his dad retired.

Terry had a love for learning and would often enjoy reading the dictionary and finding new words. He had a special talent of arranging words on paper to create a message or poem that would touch hearts so tenderly. These many poems remain with family and friends to fill their hearts with love for this special man and his love for them.

Terry met, courted, and married Elaine Rodeback in the Idaho Falls LDS Temple for time and eternity on February 12th, 1980. Their eternal family began to grow and Terry continued to work hard to support this family he loved – 9 children, 5 daughters-in-law, eleven grandchildren and a posterity that will continue to grow for years to come.

Family has always been important to him and he strived to teach his children the same values and gospel principles that sustained him in life. He led by

example, even, and maybe especially, while facing adversity.

His life changed in 2004 as he was diagnosed with lymphoma and leukemia and through the years other cancers and complications were added to his challenge. This path was not an easy one but with Elaine by his side and with the help and prayers of his children, family, and friends, and an unwavering faith in Jesus Christ, he held strong and faithful to the end. Even in his hardest moments he could be heard saying "I'm fine!"

Terry Wayne Hebdon passed away December 10th, 2014 in the Wenatchee Valley Hospital, surrounded by his beloved wife, some of his "best buddies" and supported by the love and prayers of others.

He will be missed but never forgotten.

“ It's probably way too late to share this with the family, but here goes... I woke up this morning, some three years after the death of one of my favorite missionary companions in Spain, wanting to try to find him and renew the old acquaintance, only to see that Terry Hebdon, my first Jr. Companion in Barcelona, had passed away back in December, 2014. (Only 57 years old I think) Let me just say that out of all my companions in Spain over a two year period, most of whom I truly enjoyed serving with, Terry was truly a special spirit and I considered him a great Companion, Untiring Servant of The Lord and my Friend. I didn't expect to wake up to this or to the tears I'm shedding as I type this up. If any of his family ever sees this, I just want them to know that Elder Hebdon was my first "trainee" if you want to call it that and I had only been in the mission field for 3 months when I got him and he, only 1 month. I'm not the easiest person to live with I suppose, but Terry handled me and my temperament so well. He and I worked so well together. We broke the mission record back then for the most discussions taught in one single week, during March 1st thru 7th of 1977 and we just taught so many all during our short two months together. We baptized a young man named Antonio Rodriguez. Many missionaries never got to experience the joy of baptizing any of their investigators, so it was quite something for Terry and me to be able to share The Gospel with Antonio and have him feel The Spirit and catch the vision and desire to join The Church, so early in our service in Spain. Antonio went on to serve a mission himself a year or two later. We talked about our futures together once in awhile and the only thing Terry wanted to do for the rest of his life was be a Farmer. It was in his blood and there was no question. He was no stranger to work. No matter what I wanted us to be doing, he never had a complaining word and never showed anything but pure enthusiasm for the work. He made that two months of my life a couple of the best and especially as a missionary in a country far from home. I know that ALL mankind is endowed with Divine Potential, but I am quite convinced that Terry will definitely fulfill his Divine Potential and continue onto great and marvelous things in the eternities. I hope we will meet again at some point down our eternal timelines. God
