“I wasn’t ready; I needed more time;” – people will never understand these words that my daughters Jessica and Jacinda have said to me over the past few days in the untimely and very, very unfortunate death of their mother. These words have left me speechless for the past few days -

Jessica and Jacinda, everyone will talk around the shadowed remains of your mother and likely not talk about the loss you feel or its meaning in your lives. Instead, your mother’s death will be announced casually, “...my mother died last week...”, and that will be that. Someone will respond, “...oh, I’m so sorry; I hope she didn’t suffer...” In fact, everyone will seem to accept this as an ordinary progression of life.

Your mother’s death is a significant event, a major transition, a passage of life... the security touchstone shared with wounded memories – so I find it hard to place into words the profound appreciation which each of you should have for your mother.... death ends a life but it doesn’t end a relationship that lives on in the minds, heart, soul, and actions of each of you and in your children.

Who each of you were before your mother’s death is not who you will be after this painful event. Understand and learn from the changes that occurred as a result of the early loss of your mother. It can, and likely will, take years for you to accept this loss you grieve; the loss we all grieve for you.

While words can never fully express how in this time of bereft, the deepest sympathy we have for you and your families – may God continue to comfort and give your strength to carry on such a loss. You (we) will never be able to forget your mother, as she will always be in our heart.
