With her fun loving, outgoing personality, she asked him to the Sadie Hawkins dance her junior year and his senior year of high school and the rest is history. They were married October 19, 1973 and never looked back. Chris was the first to join their family in 1976 and Lisa followed in 1978. They farmed northeast of Moses Lake for the past 45 years.

Vicky was a lifelong lover of animals, and they brought her immense joy. In particular, horses. Vicky loved horses and rodeo, and while riding her horse Ginger, she was the Moses Lake Round-up Rodeo Princess for the 1972-1973 season.
