Virginia Valdez, 31 of Moses Lake, Washington passed away November 9, 2021. She was born in 1990 in Moses Lake, Washington to parents, Torivio Valdez Jr. and Irene Lopez Valdez. She was the youngest of five siblings. Virginia is a 2009 MLHS graduate, along with her AAS degree through BBCC participating in the Running Start program, she received her Bachelor of Science through CW in 2014, and received her Bachelor of Science/Management and leadership through WGU Washington in 2017, fulfilling her late father, Torivio Valdez Jr's dream.
