Warren Strader, 71, Moses Lake resident and formerly of Othello passed away from heart failure, Wednesday, April 14, 2011 with his wife Gladys and his grandson Curtis by his side, Warren passed peacefully. A memorial service will be held at 10:00 a.m., Saturday, April 16, 2011 at Kayser's Chapel. Warren was born on January 3, 1940 in Galahad, Alberta, Canada to Donald and Mae Strader.
