Yajaira Jazmine Martinez, a devoted mother, loving wife, daughter, and sister, passed away leaving behind a legacy of unwavering devotion and intentional love—the kind that held her family together and made a house feel like home. Born on March 20, 1987, in McAllen, Texas, to Raul G. and Maria Soledad Martinez, Yajaira carried within her a nurturing spirit that would define her entire life. As a sister to Beverly, Rebecca, and Raul Jr., she loved with a mother's heart, always caring, always checking in, always making sure everyone was okay.

After spending her early years in Tukwila, Washington, Yajaira moved to Warden, where her story truly began. A proud Warden Cougar, she found joy not only in school, but in the people she loved. It was there that her lifelong love story with Luis Antonio Martinez II took root. What began with playful teasing in middle school grew into something unbreakable, the beginning of their own whole new world together. She would sit in the stands, watching him play football and wrestle, cheering him on with loud pride—already his biggest fan, and always in his corner.

After graduating from Warden High School, Yajaira continued her education at Central Washington University, earning her Bachelor's Degree in Education. She built a meaningful career as a Public Benefit Specialist 4 with Home and Community Services, where her compassion and patience reflected her

natural desire to help others.

More than anything, Yajaira's life was her family. Her love story with Luis, her high school sweetheart, her protector, and her partner in everything, was one admired by many. She was his queen, his peace, his playful partner, his passenger princess, content simply being by his side wherever life took them, even if it meant starting over somewhere new or following him across the country. She supported him without hesitation, always believing in the life they were building together.

As a mother, Yajaira was everything. Luis Alexander (8) and Alessandra Jasmine (6) were her entire world. She loved them deeply through every planned activity, every organized routine, every bedtime, and every moment she could pour into them. She wanted her children to experience everything, to have everything she once wished for, and she made sure of it. She also carried the memory of her daughter, Alexis Montserrat, with quiet strength and endless love. She reminded her children that their sister was always with them, an angel watching over them and forever part of their story.

Yajaira found joy in caring for her family and for herself. She took pride in her routines, in feeling good, and in the way she carried herself. She loved her skincare, her walks, and anything that made her feel refreshed, glowing, and confident. She would always remind her sisters to take care of themselves too, sharing her little tips and reminders along the way. For Yajaira, it was never about vanity, but about showing up as her best self for the people she loved most.

Faith and family were the center of Yajaira's life. A devoted member of the Catholic Church of the Assumption in Bellingham, she lived guided by her beliefs and her deep connection to her culture. She believed in *darle calor a la casa de nuestros abuelos*, in bringing her children back to where it all began, so they could feel the same love that raised her.

She was the one who kept everyone together, the one making the plans, always asking, "Guys, what are we doing?" "What's the plan?" "Where are we

going to eat?” because to her, being together was everything. Whether it was trips to Mexico, Texas, Great Wolf Lodge, or Disneyland, she understood that these moments were more than trips. They were memories, traditions, and time spent together as a family.

Yajaira’s presence was soft but powerful. She brought warmth, structure, and beauty into the lives around her. She loved deeply, gave endlessly, and made sure no one ever felt alone.

Though she is no longer with us, her love will continue to guide her children, live within her family, and remain in every tradition she created, every plan she made, and every moment she held together.

Those who knew and loved Yajaira understand just how deeply she loved, and why this goodbye is so difficult, because as she would have reminded us, how lucky we are to have something that makes saying goodbye so hard.
